

GREEN MOUNTAIN POWER CORPORATION
ALL DIVISIONS
RESIDENTIAL TIME-OF-USE RATE 61

AVAILABILITY:

Except as noted below, this rate is available to residential customers for single-phase electric service at secondary voltage in individual private dwellings or individual apartments, including electric house heating and water heating, and, on an optional basis, to farms engaged principally in the raising of crops, horticulture, forestry, husbandry, stock raising, dairying, or poultry raising and egg production. This rate is not available to customers other than farms to serve nonresidential purposes with a combined connected load in excess of 5 KW.

Special contract rates may be required for customers whose unique requirements impose significant costs upon the Company that are not recovered through application of the Company's standard tariffs. These contract rates will be subject to approval of the Vermont Public Service Board.

Customers must remain on Rate 61 for a minimum of 12 monthly billing periods. The customer shall remain on Rate 61 thereafter unless consumption during each of twelve consecutive months is less than 6600 kWh.

DURATION OF CONTRACT:

One year and such subsequent 12-month periods as the Company may require until cancelled by the Customer on 60 days' written notice or by an Order of the Vermont Public Service Board.

RATE:

Monthly Customer Charge of \$14.30 plus

During Peak Hours:

All energy at \$0.15218 per kWh.

During Off-Peak Hours:

All energy at \$0.06764 per kWh.

Peak hours shall be a period of 16 consecutive hours selected by the Company between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on weekdays (Monday through Friday) only. All other hours are considered off-peak.

ALTERNATIVE REGULATION PLAN

This tariff is subject to the Company's Alternative Regulation Plan Rider ("ARP Rider"), which includes a quarterly Power Adjustor and an annual Earnings Sharing Adjustor. These adjustors appear as separate line items on the customer's monthly bill. For a complete description of these adjustors, see the ARP Rider.

LOW INCOME PILOT PROGRAM

Charges under this tariff, prior to any adjustment for the Power and Earnings Sharing Adjustors and Renewable Energy Support Rider, are subject to a 10% discount under the low-income Pilot Program for customers with a family income of 200% of federal poverty level or below and that enroll in the program. The Pilot Program expires on or before July 11, 2010. A more complete description is contained in the Pilot Program, which is available from the Company.

MINIMUM CHARGE:

The customer charge of \$14.30 per month unless a higher minimum applies, as provided in the Terms and Conditions.

SUSPENSION OF SERVICE:

Where service has been suspended at customer's request, the minimum charge shall not be applicable during such suspension, but in lieu thereof, an initial service fee of \$35.00 plus a reconnect fee of \$35.00 during working hours or \$150.00 during other than normal working hours shall be made when service is re-established at the request of the customer.

Move Ins-Move-Outs: The Company shall provide a credit of \$35.00 to any customer whose Move In or Move Out order is not completed within three business days of the date promised to the customer on the Service Order. See Terms and Conditions tariff for additional credit instructions.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

The above rate is net, billed monthly or bi-monthly, at the option of the Company and payable upon presentation of the bill.

The Company's other Terms and Conditions in effect from time to time, where not inconsistent with any specific provisions hereof, are a part of this rate.

EFFECTIVE:

Effective on a bills rendered basis on or after January 1, 2008.
