

GREEN MOUNTAIN POWER CORPORATION
ALL DIVISIONS
STREET - AREA - FLOOD LIGHTING RATE 16

AVAILABILITY:

Street, area and flood lighting service is available under this rate to any city, village, town, fire district, political subdivision or individual customer, who was receiving service prior to April 30, 1992, in accordance with the specifications hereinafter set forth. This rate is not available for new installations.

DURATION OF CONTRACT:

One year from date of installation and thereafter until canceled by the customer on 60 days' written notice.

SUSPENSION OF SERVICE:

Where service has been suspended at Customer's request the minimum charge shall not be applicable during such suspension, but in lieu thereof, an initial service fee of \$35.00 plus a reconnection fee of \$35.00 during working hours or \$150.00 during other than normal working hours shall be made when service is re-established at the request of the customer for each connection required. Service may not be suspended for a period of time less than four months.

Move Ins-Move-Outs: The Company shall provide a credit of \$35.00 to any customer whose Move In or Move Out order is not completed within three business days of the date promised to the customer on the Service Order. See Terms and Conditions tariff for additional credit instructions.

LATE PAYMENT CHARGE:

Payment for service under this rate is due on presentation of the monthly bill. If the company on or before the next monthly billing date does not receive payment, a late payment charge of 1% shall be imposed upon the unpaid balance, including any prior unpaid late payment charges. The late payment charge shall be assessed on such unpaid balances once each month after it is initially imposed on an unpaid balance, so long as a balance remains unpaid. The Late Payment charge is not applicable to residential accounts.

EQUIPMENT:

The Company shall furnish, own and maintain all poles, wires, standards, lamps and other equipment and apparatus necessary for supplying the service herein specified. All equipment shall be of standard design and construction. Ornamental poles shall be of steel, aluminum, concrete, fiberglass or wood.

HOURS OF OPERATION:

All lights shall be operated each and every night from one-half hour after sunset until one-half hour before sunrise, a total of approximately 4,380 hours each year.

FAILURE OF LIGHTS TO BURN, STREETLIGHT AND OUTDOOR LIGHT REPAIRS:

The Company will perform maintenance and lamp replacement during normal working hours as the Company is notified of any outage. The Company will repair within seven business days of the date promised to the customer on the Service Order.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

The below rate is net, billed monthly or bi-monthly at the option of the Company and payable upon presentation of bill.

The company reserves the right to cancel the contract for service and remove all lighting equipment that is repeatedly subjected to physical damage regardless of the cause of such damage.

The Company's other Terms and Conditions in effect from time to time, where not inconsistent with any specific provisions hereof, are a part of this rate.

INSTALLATION:

Where it is necessary to install an overhead service to a light installed on an existing pole or on a new service pole a distance in excess of 150 feet from the Company's existing overhead system, or an underground service to a wood or ornamental pole installed at a location in excess of 150 feet distant from the Company's existing overhead or underground system, or an underground service to an ornamental light fixture at a distance in excess of 50 feet from the Company's existing overhead or underground system, the Customer will be required to reimburse the Company for the installation cost attributable to such excess distance. The allowable distances referred to above are intended to be straight-line measurements between the bases of poles or between the existing underground system and the base of the pole supporting the fixture.

The Customer will be required to reimburse the Company for any other excess installation costs created by unusual conditions where the estimated income will be insufficient to justify the estimated cost of construction.

ALTERNATIVE REGULATION PLAN

This tariff is subject to the Company's Alternative Regulation Plan Rider ("ARPRider"), which includes a quarterly Power Adjustor and an annual Earnings Sharing Adjustor; except that the Power Adjustor does not apply to service under this tariff. The Earnings Sharing Adjustor appears as a separate line item on the customer's monthly bill. For a complete description of the adjustor, see the ARP Rider.

METERED SERVICE TO CUSTOMER OWNED LIGHTS:

The Company, at its option, reserves the right to convert existing meter energy service to customer owned street and area lighting to non-metered energy service according to the provisions of Outdoor Lighting Rate 18.

SYSTEM CONVERSIONS FROM AN EXISTING LIGHTING SYSTEM TO AN ALTERNATIVE LIGHTING SYSTEM:

The Company will have the right to require those customers wishing to convert existing lighting systems to alternative lighting systems to reimburse the Company for the undepreciated cost of the existing lights plus any cost to the Company of making the conversion not recovered in the monthly charge for the alternative lights.

EFFECTIVE:

Effective on a bills rendered basis on or after March 1, 2010.
